Does your University/College accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University/College?	Yes
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University/College?	We recognise that there is a difference between HKALE and GCE A level grades. Applications are assessed on individual merit and differentiated offers are made on a case by case basis.
Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University/College?	All law applicants must sit the LNAT exam, details can be found at the following website http://www.lnat.ac.uk
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must take?	No, provided they have HKCEE grade 5*-4 in English Language
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must reach?	Each academic department sets its own English Language requirements so it is important to look at their individual entry requirements. Generally we would require IELTS 6.5 - 7.0 or HKCEE English Language grade 5*-4 (A-C).
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must take? When must they be taken?	No (other than the LNAT for law applicants)
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College?	No, unless they are applying to read Medicine and Dentistry. These subjects have a restriction on the number of places available to non-EU applicants. This quota is imposed by the UK government and is currently set at 19 for Medicine and 4 for Dentistry.

Is consideration given to factors other than examination performance for overseas students wishing to apply for entry to your University/College?	Whilst exam performance is obviously an important element of a student's application, all aspects of the UCAS form are taken into consideration, including the academic reference and the personal statement. Some departments also conduct interviews.
Does your University/College accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes. Our undergraduate prospectus also lists IB results needed for entry on to each programme. http://www.bris.ac.uk/prospectus/undergraduate/2009
Does your University/College accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	The University is primarily an adult environment and most applicants for admission to the University will be at least 18 on entry. If you will be under 18 on entry, the Academic Registrar will need to be convinced that satisfactory arrangements have been made for your accommodation and pastoral care.
