Does your University accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University?	Yes. HKCEE is considered equivalent to the UK GCSE qualification. HKALE is considered equivalent to GCE A-Level.
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University?	Entry requirements vary and are dependent on the subject area applied for. Offers of admission for applicants with HKALE qualifications are usually made at the same level as GCE A-Level. Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University?	No.
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take?	Applicants from Hong Kong are expected to have a pass at grade C (grade B for Laws admissions) in HKCEE English Language (Syllabus B) or a pass at grade C (grade B for Laws admissions) in the HKALE Use of English. Alternatively, they will need to take one of the standard English Language tests recognised by UCL.
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must reach?	English Language proficiency requirements vary between faculties. Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take? When must they be taken?	All applicants applying to study Medicine are required to sit the Biomedical Admissions Test (BMAT), see <a href="http://www.bmat.org.uk/">http://www.bmat.org.uk/</a> . The test is taken at the beginning of November for entry in the following September. All applicants applying for any Law programme are required to sit the Laws National Admissions Test (LNAT), see <a href="http://www.lnat.ac.uk/">http://www.lnat.ac.uk/</a> . The LNAT must be sat by 15 <sup>th</sup> January of the admissions cycle in which the application is made.
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University?	With the exception of A100 Medicine, there is no quota on overseas students. UCL is restricted by government quota to admitting 25 non-EU applicants per year to Medicine.

Is consideration given to factors other than examination performance for overseas students wishing to apply for entry to your University?	UCL takes a holistic approach when considering applicants for admission. Examination performance and grade predications are important but the personal statement and the academic reference are also taken into account. Some subjects might also require samples of written work or a portfolio to be submitted.
Does your University accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes. Grade requirements depend on the degree programme applied for. IB requirements are listed in the prospectus at <a href="http://www.ucl.ac.uk/prospective-students/undergraduate-degrees/index.shtml">http://www.ucl.ac.uk/prospective-students/undergraduate-degrees/index.shtml</a> .
Does your University accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	UCL prefers students to be 18, and at least a minimum of 17 years of age at enrolment. We do, exceptionally, admit applicants under the age of 17 but admittance is subject to approval from the relevant College committee and requires pastoral measures being in place for the student. The expectation is that such students live with a parent or guardian whilst studying.
