Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take?	HKCEE English (Syllabus B) is considered direct equivalents to GCSE English, which is a recognized English Language proficiency qualification.
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must reach?	For overseas students, our minimum required English score is a C grade in GCSE English, or 6.0 in IELTS. Some courses would ask for a higher grade.
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take? When must they be taken?	No.
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University?	No.

Whilst exam performance is obviously the most important element, other aspects of the application will be taken into consideration, including the academic reference, the personal statement, and other evidence supporting the applicant's ability & study motivation.
Does your University accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes. Typical offers range from 34 to 38 points. Some courses have requirements on subjects studied at the Higher Level.
Does your University accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	Yes, but it is preferable if students have already attained the age of 18 years if not living with parent(s) or guardian(s).
