

HONG KONG DIPLOMA OF SECONDARY EDUCATION EXAMINATION 2025

Instructions to Applicants (School Candidates)

A. Examination Regulations

1. All candidates must comply with the examination regulations as stipulated in the ‘2025 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination Regulations and Assessment Frameworks’ and ‘Handbook for Candidates’, including the disclaimer in Sections 5.2 and 5.3 of the Examination Regulations regarding the Authority’s discretion in making changes to the HKDSE examination timetable, cancellation of the Examination and restricting participation in the Examination due to special circumstances. Candidates should also ensure that they can comply with necessary statutory requirements for sitting the HKDSE in Hong Kong, such as applicable visa or stay conditions before the examinations. Candidates in breach of any examination regulations or requirements are subject to penalty.

B. Entry Qualifications

2. Only bona fide Secondary 6 (S6) students in the school year 2024/2025 of registered schools approved for participation in the 2025 HKDSE (‘the Examination’) may be entered as school candidates in the Examination. The students must be studying at the registered address of the schools. (For exceptional entry to Category B subjects, please see **paragraph 7(3)** below.)
3. For any school candidates who enter for the 2025 HKDSE, their registration entries must be approved by the school principal and submitted through the school.
4. A candidate may only enter for the 2025 HKDSE either as a school candidate or as a private candidate but not both in the same examination year.

C. Selection of Subjects

5. The HKDSE subjects are divided into **three categories**, including **Category A Senior Secondary subjects**, **Category B Applied Learning subjects** and **Category C Other Languages subjects**. Candidates may enter a maximum of eight subjects which may come from any of Categories A, B and/or C.

6. Registration for Category A subjects

- (1) 23 Senior Secondary subjects are offered in the Category A examinations. In any subjects examinable in both Chinese and English, candidates may enter for one language version only in the same Examination.
- (2) For subjects with a School-based Assessment (SBA) component, schools are required to fulfil the SBA requirements for the subjects entered by candidates of their schools. The HKEAA will not accept entries for subjects from candidates presented by schools which have not joined the SBA scheme for those subjects.

For SBA tasks involving work outside class, students have to sign a declaration form to confirm that the work they produce is their own. When submitting the SBA marks online, teachers are required to confirm that, to the best of their knowledge, the work presented for assessment is the student’s own work. School principals are required to confirm that the SBA is conducted in accordance with the requirements of the HKEAA.

- (3) School candidates who repeat S6 in schools are required to be re-assessed in S6 and meet the SBA requirements of the respective subjects entered. If the schools do not offer the elective subject(s) that the candidates wish to re-take in the examination, the candidates may apply for exemption from the SBA for that particular subject(s). The candidates’ subject result will be based entirely on their public examination result (see also **Regulation 7.9**). This special exemption does not apply to the core subjects – Chinese Language and English Language. **Applications for exemption must be submitted to the Authority on or before 11 September 2024.** Schools should fill in the application form (available for download from the main page of HKDSE Examination Online Services) and submit it to the Authority for consideration together with the relevant supporting documents.

- (4) If you wish to enter for any practical subjects which require laboratory/workshop facilities (i.e. Biology /Chemistry/Physics/Design and Applied Technology/Technology and Living), your school should have declared that it can provide the laboratory/workshop facilities for practical work.
- (5) You should pay attention to the following notes when entering for the subjects below:

Mathematics – You may choose to take either the Compulsory Part only or the Compulsory Part plus one of the modules of the Extended Part. As the Compulsory Part and the Extended Part of Mathematics are counted as one subject only, candidates must choose the same language version for both parts.

Design and Applied Technology – You are required to choose any **TWO** of the five modules for Paper 2 during registration and attempt the **TWO chosen** modules in the examination.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) – There will be **three elective parts** in Paper 2 of ICT. You are required to attempt **any two elective parts** in the examination. You need **not** select the elective parts at the time of registration.

Music – You must use the same language version chosen at the time of registration for taking all papers of Music subject, including the following parts (if applicable): oral presentation in Paper 2, reflective reports in Papers 3 and 4C, and viva voce in Paper 4B (if applicable). Besides, you are required to provide the supplementary information including the paper selection for the elective part such as the musical instrument(s) to be used for Paper 4B (Performing II) (if applicable) for your school to complete the relevant application options on the Registration System. If you wish to apply for exemption from the examination for Paper 4B/Paper 4C, you should produce proofs of recognised qualifications to your school for verification and uploading to the Registration System. The copy of your certificate should bear a school chop before scanning. You may be required to submit the original of the supporting document to the HKEAA for verification, if necessary. You may download the ‘Exemption Information for Paper 4B and Paper 4C’ at the HKEAA website (www.hkeaa.edu.hk → HKDSE → Assessment Information → Subject Information → Category A: Senior Secondary Subjects (Elective Subjects) → Music → Assessment Framework) for more details. If you need to update the qualifications for exemption from the examination for Paper 4B/Paper 4C, you should submit the necessary documents on or before **16 December 2024**. This arrangement is only applicable to candidates who have applied for exemption on or before 5 December 2024. Candidates entering for Music Paper 4B but have not been exempted from the relevant examination should note the following points for taking the practical examination:

- (a) The HKEAA will only provide a piano for the Music practical examination. Candidates or accompanists who use instrument(s) other than the piano must provide them on their own.
- (b) Candidates must perform on the instrument(s) and/or voice chosen upon registration. Performance on extra instrument(s) or voice not chosen during registration will not be assessed by examiners. On the other hand, candidates who fail to perform on all instrument(s) and/or voice chosen during registration will receive a mark penalty.
- (c) Candidates must inform the Authority in writing via the school within the registration period if it is not suitable for the practical examination to be conducted in the designated examination centre, i.e. a room with a piano. The reason and the specifications of the instrument(s) to be used should be stated in the letter for the Authority’s consideration and approval.
- (d) Candidates must submit to the examiner on-site the copy(ies) of scores and/or lyrics of their performed pieces on the day of the practical examination. The copy(ies) of scores and/or lyrics will be returned to the candidates after the examination.

Physical Education – You are required to choose **ONE** activity from Physical Activity 1 and **TWO** activities from Physical Activity 2 for Paper 3 (Practical Examination) for your school to complete the relevant application options on the Registration System. You are also required to submit a duly signed Health Declaration to your school for uploading at the time of registration. Candidates may apply for exemption (partial or full) from Athletics/Swimming practical examination by submitting officially certified results of recognised competitions organised by The Schools Sports Federation of Hong Kong, China/Hong Kong, China Association of Athletics Affiliates Limited/Hong Kong China Swimming Association. Candidates should produce the officially certified results to their schools. Only the officially certified results obtained in competitions participated from December of the S4 school year to November of the S6 school year (i.e. from December 2022 to November 2024) will be accepted. Applications for exemption from Paper 3 (Practical Examination) together with the document of certified results should be submitted by the SEOs and endorsed by the School Principal in the Registration System before the registration deadline. Candidates may update the results **on or before 16 December 2024** (applicable to those who have applied for exemption on or before 5 December 2024). The application is subject to HKEAA’s approval.

Applications for amendments/exemption to the physical activity(ies) for Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination) will **not** be accepted **after 5 December 2024**.

Business, Accounting and Financial Studies / Design and Applied Technology / Ethics and Religious Studies / Technology and Living / Visual Arts – The requirements of selection of paper/module for these subjects are stipulated in the 2025 HKDSE Examination Regulations and Assessment Frameworks which is accessible from the HKEAA website at www.hkeaa.edu.hk → HKDSE → Assessment Information → Subject Information.

Literature in English, Technology and Living, Physical Education and Music – The examinations of these four subjects are tentatively scheduled for 17 April (Literature in English/Technology and Living/Music), 22 April (Technology and Living), 23 April (Literature in English/Technology and Living/Physical Education/Music), or 2 May 2025 (Technology and Living/Physical Education/Music). The exact examination dates will be finalised around early November 2024 after the normal closing date of registration, and two or more subjects will be scheduled on the same day only if there is no overlap of candidates.

Note: Any subsequent requests for change of paper/module/language version/musical instruments (for Music)/physical activities (for Physical Education) / application for exemption from Music Paper 4B/Paper 4C/Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination) or withdrawal from exemption, after the completion of registration (i.e. submission of entries by the school principal) will be regarded as a change of subject (see **Section H** for more details)

7. Registration for Category B (Applied Learning) subjects

- (1) There are 58 Applied Learning (ApL) subjects under Category B (i.e. courses of 2023-25 cohort) which are approved by the Education Bureau and developed by the course providers. Normally, the first year of study (Y1) commences in the first or second term of Secondary 4 (S4) or the first term of Secondary 5 (S5), and the second year (Y2) is completed in S5 and/or Secondary 6 (S6).
- (2) The assessments of ApL subjects are undertaken by the course providers. The HKEAA is responsible for monitoring the process and the moderation of final assessment results.
- (3) An S5 student or S4/S5 repeater who is a Y2 student of an ApL subject in the school year 2024/2025 may enter for ‘ApL subjects only’ of the 2025 HKDSE as a school candidate with the support of the school principal and the course provider concerned. Schools should submit the entry of these candidates for ‘ApL subjects only’ via the Registration System within the registration period. S5 students or S4/S5 repeaters entering for ‘ApL subjects only’ as school candidates are not required to seek special approval from the HKEAA or submit supporting documents via their school. Endorsement will be given by the school principal upon confirmation with the course provider(s) via clicking the related declaration in the Registration System before the submission of entries so that the students’ results of the ApL subject(s) will be shown on their 2025 HKDSE results notice and certificate (if applicable). If the entry is invalid, the candidate concerned will be informed via the school and a refund of the examination fees for the Category B subject(s) will be made to the candidate.
- (4) An S6 repeater may re-take the same ApL subject(s) as a school candidate in the 2025 HKDSE with the support of the course provider(s) concerned subject to the proviso that the Y2 ApL assessment results to be submitted to the HKEAA for moderation should form at least 50% of the subject total. Schools should register the candidate(s) concerned for the ApL subject(s) as well as other subjects via the Registration System within the registration period.
- (5) Although there are no public examinations for ApL subjects, candidates (including S5 students or S4/S5 repeaters mentioned in **paragraph 7(3)** above) are reminded to register for the ApL subject(s) as well as other subjects via their school within the registration period. Otherwise, their results of Category B subject(s) will not be shown on the 2025 HKDSE results notice and certificate (if applicable) nor could not be carried forward to the 2026 HKDSE and beyond.

8. Registration for Category C (Other Languages) subjects

Five Other Languages subjects, viz. French, German, Japanese, Korean and Spanish are offered under Category C in the 2025 HKDSE. Under the new arrangements of the registration of Category C subjects starting from the 2025 HKDSE, you should pay attention to the following notes when entering for Category C subjects:

- (i) Candidates have to take the stipulated language examinations administrated in Hong Kong by the official examination organisations which are the official providers of the language examinations concerned. You

should enrol yourself with the examination administrators of the language examinations according to the schedule of the respective language examinations.

- (ii) Your results obtained in these examinations at the stipulated minimum proficiency level or above will be included in the HKDSE Category C results. The HKDSE accepts results obtained in the language examinations taken **within two years preceding the HKDSE the candidate sits**. For the 2025 HKDSE, the results of the relevant language examinations taken **from January 2023 to December 2024** are accepted. If you take the language examinations more than once at the same or different levels, only the highest level and result attained will be reported under the HKDSE Category C subjects.
 - (iii) Starting from the 2025 HKDSE, the June Registration period has been cancelled. You need to register Category C subjects in the same HKDSE registration period so that your Category C subjects examination results will be included in the HKDSE results. You must give consent to the respective examination providers to pass their results in the stipulated language examinations to the HKEAA for inclusion as the Category C subject results. **Prior to the registration, you should communicate well with your school and produce the officially certified results of the subject(s) concerned for your school to complete the relevant application on the Registration System.**
 - (iv) If you need to update your examination results documentation for Category C subjects, you should submit the necessary documents via the Registration System by your school on or before **28 February 2025**. This arrangement is only applicable to candidates who have entered for the Category C subjects concerned on or before 5 December 2024.
- 9. The results for Categories A, B & C subjects of the 2025 HKDSE are tentatively scheduled to be released on 16 July 2025. Please visit the JUPAS website at <http://www.jupas.edu.hk> for further information about JUPAS procedures.
 - 10. You should provide your school with the subject(s) that you would like to enter for the 2025 HKDSE. The timetable for the 2025 HKDSE (tentative) is shown on pages 12 to 13.
 - 11. The speaking examination of English Language in Category A will be video-recorded for the purposes of remarking and/or handling examination irregularities.

D. Instructions on Completing Registration Entries

- 12. Registration for Category A, Category B and Category C subjects of the 2025 HKDSE will be accepted from **11 September to 8 October 2024**. Schools presenting students for the examination are required to register with the HKEAA via the Registration System. Hard copies of entry forms will **not** be accepted.
- 13. After completing the entry of your registration data into the Registration System, your School Examination Officer (SEO) will give you a copy of 'Candidate Entry Information Checklist (CEIC)', together with the 'Instructions to Applicants (School Candidates)' and the 'Information Sheet for Checking of Candidate Entry Information Checklist (CEIC)', to verify your entry data.
- 14. You are required to read the 'Instructions to Applicants (School Candidates)' carefully, in particular **Section E** concerning the collection of personal data, and refer to this document and the 'Information Sheet for Checking of Candidate Entry Information Checklist (CEIC)'.

While checking your CEIC, you should make sure that your full name in English and your Chinese name (if any) on your CEIC are identical to the names on your HKID card/valid identification document as the names will be printed on the HKDSE certificate. You should use the same identification document number for the HKDSE registration and JUPAS/tertiary institution application. Extra attention should be paid to the subjects for which you have entered and your selection of paper(s)/module for the relevant subjects/musical instruments (for Music)/physical activities (for Physical Education), the Supplementary Information for Category C subject(s), the language version of the subjects entered and the level of assistance for examination fee remission. In particular, if you have registered for any Category B ApL subject(s), you should pay special attention to the name of the subject(s) as some of the subject names are very similar. Schools should take note that they cannot submit more than one entry for their candidates for the 2025 HKDSE, whether for the same or different subjects.

- 15. **To facilitate the HKEAA in contacting you or disseminating important examination-related information to you via email (or SMS in case of emergency), you should provide your school with your email address (mandatory) and SMS local phone number (optional).** Candidates providing SMS local phone number will receive their examination results and rechecking/remarking results (if applicable) via SMS.

(Note: Candidates who do not have an email address should set up an account and must not use shared email accounts. They should ensure that the setting of the email account can accept the email domain of HKEAA (i.e. @hkdse.hkeaa.edu.hk and @hkeaa.edu.hk). Otherwise, the emails from HKEAA may only be received in the Spam/Junk folders.)

16. You should check the information on your CEIC and read the ‘Declaration’ on your CEIC carefully. A supplementary fee in addition to the required subject fee (if applicable) will be charged to candidates on any requests for addition/substitution of subjects made after endorsement by the School Principal.
17. If you discover any errors in your CEIC, you should immediately inform your SEO who will update your entry record on the Registration System accordingly. When you confirm that all entry data on your CEIC is correct, you should sign on your CEIC and return it to your SEO. Your school will keep the original copy of your CEIC for record, but will provide you with a photocopy for reference. The candidate number printed on the CEIC will be used as one of the login data for logging into the HKDSE Apps.
18. The SEO will submit the registration entry confirmed by you to the School Principal for endorsement. Upon the completion of endorsement, SEOs should print the demand notes and distribute them to individual candidates for payment of examination fees **by 11:59 pm on 15 October 2024**. Candidates who have applied for examination fee remission with ‘Full’ subsidy will also receive a demand note for record purposes but you need not pay the examination fees. Regarding the payment methods, candidates should be advised to download the Instructions for Payment of Examination Fees from the HKEAA website (www.hkeaa.edu.hk → HKDSE → Examination Administration → Examination Registration & Fees → Examination Fees). Upon the settlement of the payment, you will receive an email with your candidate number. You are reminded to keep this email as you are required to login the HKDSE Apps by using your candidate number.
19. You are required to submit to your school one recent photograph (3 cm x 4 cm) showing your head and shoulders. Schools should keep these photographs and affix them on the admission forms when they are issued in mid-February 2025 (tentative). Candidates who have entered for the Physical Education and/or Music examinations should submit an extra photograph to their school for affixing it on the Admission Form for Practical Examinations which will be issued in late January 2025 (tentative).

E. Your Personal Data and Answer Scripts

20. Personal data of candidates are used for the purpose of conducting the examination and the subsequent assessment of their performance. The entry data are supplied by students through their schools. Whether you provide the requested personal data is voluntary. However, if you fail to provide all the data, or if any of the data provided is inaccurate or incomplete, the processing of your examination results will be affected and hence the HKEAA may not accept your entry. Assessment data are provided by markers, checkmarkers, examiners and schools (school data are only for subjects/papers with School-based Assessment - the assessments are part of the normal teaching/learning process at schools).
21. The personal data, including examination results, may also be used for the following purposes:
 - (1) assisting tertiary institutions and other government/public organisations in their admission processes;
 - (2) assisting government/public organisations in respect of their requests for information in granting scholarships;
 - (3) confirming with relevant Government authorities the eligibility of candidates by transferring necessary data of the school candidates concerned to these Government authorities for verification;
 - (4) certifying candidates’ examination results in response to legitimate requests;
 - (5) conducting educational research and/or analysis in an anonymous format in which the identities of candidates are not traceable; and
 - (6) processing of any refund or payment in relation to the examination by the Authority’s designated banks (or their appointees).
22. In compliance with the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance, access to all personal data will be made available, on payment of a fee, to anyone who can establish his/her right to be informed of such data as are retained by the HKEAA. The procedures for applications for data access are included in the ‘Application Guide on Data Access Requests’ available at the HKEAA website at www.hkeaa.edu.hk.
23. All answer scripts submitted by candidates (including portfolios and audio/video recordings for speaking and practical examinations) and all works submitted to the Authority under the SBA and ApL subjects (including coursework and audio/video recordings), shall be the property of the Authority. All scripts and works submitted

may be handled by the Authority at any time and in any way it deems appropriate, in particular the Authority may (and may authorise third parties to) use, reproduce and/or publish those scripts and works, or any part thereof in an anonymous format in which the identities of applicants are not traceable. Also, the Authority will exercise reasonable care to protect and preserve the scripts and works submitted, but in the event of any loss or damage, as a result of which the candidate's performance cannot be assessed based on the scripts and/or the works submitted, the candidate concerned will waive all claims, if any, against the Authority.

F. Choice of Examination Centre District (Applicable to Examination Centres in Hong Kong)

24. According to Section 3.4 of the 2025 HKDSE Examination Regulations, as a condition of participation in the HKDSE, schools are obligated to make their school premises available as may be required for the conduct of examinations and place their teaching staff at the reasonable disposal of the HKEAA. **The 'Home cum District Centre (Normal Centre)' arrangements have been fully implemented in the core subject examinations (i.e. Chinese Language, English Language, Mathematics Compulsory Part and Citizenship and Social Development).** Under 'Home cum District Centre (Normal Centre)' arrangements, school candidates will be allocated to sit all the core subject examinations in the 'Home Centre' by default if their schools can provide sufficient capacity in hall(s) and/or multi-purpose rooms to accommodate their own school candidates. Regarding the centre arrangements for elective subjects, the Authority will allocate candidates to 'District Centre' according to their choice of district (see **Paragraph 26**). Candidates are advised to check with their schools for the above arrangements before registration.
25. If you opt not sitting the core subject examinations in your 'Home Centre' and can provide valid reasons, you should make a special request directly to your SEO during registration for approval by your school. The SEO should select the **'Non-home Centre (Core Subjects)'** option for you on the Registration System so that you will be allocated to 'District Centre(s)' according to your choice of district. On the other hand, if your school does not have a proper examination venue or cannot provide sufficient seating capacity to accommodate all your own school candidates, some of the candidates will be arranged to sit the core subject examinations in 'District Centre' even though the candidates have chosen 'Home Centre' by default.
26. For the 'District Centre' arrangements (applicable to elective subject examinations and candidates as stated in **Paragraph 25** who choose to sit the core subject examinations in 'Non-home centre'), the Authority will make its best effort to allocate candidates according to their choice of district. However, the actual allocation will be subject to the availability of examination accommodation in various districts. If there is no examination centre or insufficient seating capacity in a particular district, candidates will be allocated to the examination centres of a nearby district as far as practicable. **The choice of district is not applicable to speaking examination, practical examinations and small-entry subjects.** Subsequent applications for change of district/sitting the core subject examination in Home Centre to Non-home Centre and vice versa will only be considered for candidates with valid reasons. (**Note:** The Authority's marking and grading systems are completely independent of district choice.) Please refer to the list of choice of examination centre district on page 14 or at the HKEAA website (www.hkeaa.edu.hk → HKDSE → Examination Administration → Exam Registration & Fees → Exam Registration → School Candidates).

G. Examination Fees / Examination Fee Remission

27. The subject fee for language subjects (i.e. English Language and Chinese Language) of the 2025 HKDSE is HK\$747 per subject while the subject fee for other subjects is HK\$499 per subject.
28. Eligible school candidates studying S6 in the participating schools in the Mainland approved by the HKEAA and will sit the examination at designated examination centres in the Mainland are required to pay an initial fee of HK\$2,059 in addition to the subject fees when entering for the 2025 HKDSE.
29. Candidates should note the following when settling the examination fee:
 - (1) After the School Principal's endorsement of your registration entry, your SEO will provide you with a Demand Note for settling the payment of the examination fee. You should make use of one of the following channels to pay your examination fee:
 - through Internet Banking;
 - through PPS; or
 - cash payment at any 7-Eleven or Circle K convenience stores in Hong Kong.

Note:

- (i) If you are eligible for 'Full' assistance level for examination fee remission provided by the SFO, you will still receive a demand note for record purpose but you need not pay the examination fees.

- (ii) Candidates from families receiving the **Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA)** Scheme may reimburse the examination fee paid from the Social Welfare Department directly. The Social Welfare Department advises such candidates to settle their examination fee at any 7-Eleven or Circle K convenience stores in Hong Kong and keep their demand note and payment receipt properly. While applying for reimbursement, candidates shall produce the demand note and the receipt to the Social Welfare Department for verification. For candidates using other payment channels to settle their examination fee or requiring an official receipt for the examination fee paid, they may apply for one from the HKEAA Southorn Centre office free of charge.

- (2) You should settle the payment **by 11:59 pm on 15 October 2024**. For more details about the payment methods, please download the ‘Instructions for Payment of Examination Fees (School Candidates)’ from the HKEAA website (www.hkeaa.edu.hk → HKDSE Examination Administration → Exam Registration & Fees → Examination Fees).

Note: The Authority will not accept personal cheques from candidates/parents or a single cheque for a group of candidates from a school.

- (3) If the payment of the examination fees is made **between 16 October 2024 and 11:59 pm on 22 October 2024**, entries will be accepted upon payment of a **supplementary fee of \$297** per candidate in addition to the subject fees. The payment of examination fees and supplementary fee must be made at any 7-Eleven or Circle-K Convenience Stores in Hong Kong by 11:59 pm on 22 October 2024. A copy of the Demand Note must be produced at the time of payment.
- (4) As stated in Regulation 5.10 of the 2025 HKDSE Examination Regulations, the entries of candidates will not be regarded as having been accepted until the fees payable have been received in full by the HKEAA. If a candidate does not settle the examination fees by 11:59 pm on 22 October 2024, the candidate’s registration entry will be cancelled.
- (5) Examination fees are not transferable from one examination to another, nor from one candidate to another.
- (6) Examination fees will not be refunded to the following circumstances:
- (a) Candidates who are disqualified or absent; or
 - (b) Candidates who have entered for other examinations which result in a timetable clash.

Note: Candidates are advised that no special arrangements will be made in the event of a timetable clash with other examinations.

30. Applying for examination fee remission (*Not applicable to school candidates from the participating schools in the Mainland*)

- (1) Examination Fee Remission (EFR) may be granted to candidates taking the 2025 HKDSE if the following criteria are met:
- (a) (i) A Secondary 6 full-time day school student who sits for the HKDSE for the **first time** as school candidates; or
 - (ii) An adult learner who attends Secondary 6 evening courses in designated centres that are quality-assured and commissioned by the Education Bureau (EDB), and sits for the HKDSE for the **first time** as a school candidate; or
 - (iii) A Secondary 4 or Secondary 5 student who is studying Year 2 of an Applied Learning (ApL) subject in the school year 2024/2025 and is approved to enter for “ApL subjects only” in the 2025 HKDSE as a school candidate; or
- (b) First-time repeaters attending full-time day school/designated evening adult education courses are also eligible for EFR, provided that **they entered for the 2024 HKDSE for the first time as school candidates** and will sit for the HKDSE for the **second time** as school candidates in the immediate following examination year (i.e. 2025 HKDSE).
- (c) (i) Candidates whose ‘Eligibility Level’ for student finance has been assessed as ‘Full’ (eligible for full EFR) or ‘Half’ (eligible for half EFR) by the SFO; or
 - (ii) Candidates who are recommended for ‘Full’ or ‘Half’ grant of School Textbook Assistance (TA) by the attending school (only applicable to government, aided, per caput grant secondary day schools and local private day schools under the Direct Subsidy Scheme).
- (2) Candidates must apply to the HKEAA for EFR through their schools.

- (3) For 'late applications' received after 8 October 2024, candidates must pay the full examination fees first. The application procedures and refund arrangement are stated in the HKDSE Examination Circular No. (3) 2024/2025.

H. Late Entry and Subject Amendment

31. If you wish to apply for late entry/addition/substitution of subjects after your school principal's endorsement and submission of your entries to the HKEAA, you should raise your request with your SEO who may apply for late entry/amendments of subject entries for you on the Registration System during the **amendment period (tentatively scheduled from 15 November to 5 December 2024)**. Upon the school principal's endorsement, SEO should print the demand notes and distribute them to candidates concerned for payment of supplementary fees and subject fees (if applicable) **by 11:59 pm on 9 December 2024**.

- * Any subsequent request for a change of paper/module/language version/musical instruments (for Music)/physical activities (for Physical Education) / application for exemption from Music Paper 4B/Paper 4C/Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination) or withdrawal from exemption, after the completion of registration (i.e. submission of entries by the school principal) will be regarded as a substitution of subject.

Notes:

- Applications for amendments to the supplementary information for the subject of Music cannot be accepted via the Registration System.** If you have entered for Music and wish to amend the supplementary information, including changes to the musical instruments and other details for Music Paper 4B, information about exemption for Music Paper 4B/Paper 4C should **complete an application form** obtained from your school with the School Principal's approval letter and then **submit the completed form in person or via an authorised person at the HKEAA Southorn Centre office** (Address: 12/F, Southorn Centre, 130 Hennessy Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong) **on or before 5 December 2024**. You should settle the payment of the supplementary fee by credit card/Alipay/WeChat Pay/Union Pay at the HKEAA counter or pay at any 7-Eleven or Circle-K Convenience Stores in Hong Kong before the specified deadline printed on the demand note.
 - The following applications will not be accepted on or after 6 December 2024:**
 - Changes to the musical instruments and other details for Music Paper 4B;
 - Application for exemption from Music Paper 4B/Paper 4C or amendments to the exemption information;
 - Amendments to the physical activities for Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination); or
 - Application for exemption from Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination) or amendments to the exemption information.
 - Candidates who need to update their qualifications for exemption from Music Paper 4B/Paper 4C have to submit the necessary documents **on or before 16 December 2024**. This arrangement is only applicable to candidates who have applied for exemption on or before 5 December 2024.
 - Candidates who have applied for exemption from Physical Education Paper 3 (Practical Examination) on or before 5 December 2024 should update the results and submit the document (if applicable) **on or before 16 December 2024**.
 - Candidates who need to update their qualifications for Category C subjects have to submit the necessary documents **on or before 28 February 2025**. This arrangement is only applicable to candidates who have entered for the relevant Category C subject(s) on or before 5 December 2024.
32. Applications for late entry/subject amendment will normally **not be accepted after 5 December 2024**. Requests made thereafter will be exceptionally considered by the Secretary General of the HKEAA on a case-by-case basis and subject to the payment of a higher supplementary fee. **Any super-late requests for late entry/subject amendment will not be accepted after 18 March 2025 (i.e. 10 working days before the start of the first written examination on 1 April 2025)**. As for **Category C subjects**, any super-late requests for late entry/subject amendment will not be accepted **on or after 1 March 2025**.

33. The HKEAA will **not provide faxed copies of question papers to wrong-centre or wrong-version candidates.**

I. Change of Status

34. Application for change of status may be accepted at the discretion of the Authority:

(i)	Change from a school candidate to a private candidate	\$461 per candidate plus initial fee \$572 and the required subject fees (if applicable)
(ii)	Change from a private candidate to a school candidate	No supplementary fee (but the private candidate's initial fee paid will not be refunded).
(iii)	Change of school by a school candidate	\$461 per candidate

Note: In case the applications are made on or after 1 December 2024, an administrative fee of \$524 per candidate will be charged in addition to the supplementary fees.

J. Amendment of Personal Particulars and Contact Information

35. If you wish to amend your personal particulars (such as your name, identification document type and number) after submission of your registration entry, you should submit your request for amendments to the HKEAA via your school together with the supporting documents, such as HKID card, birth certificate or statutory declaration for verification **on or before 15 January 2025**. The HKEAA will update your record on the Registration System after verifying your documents. If you miss the above deadline, any information you wish to change cannot be updated on your admission form or speaking examination score sheet (if applicable). Besides, you are reminded to update your personal particulars, such as identification document number to ensure that your personal particulars registered for the HKDSE match with those in your application to the JUPAS office/tertiary institutions concerned.
36. In case of amendments of your contact information (such as contact phone number, SMS phone number, email address and correspondence address), you may request your school to update your contact information on the Registration System accordingly.

K. Amendment of Choice of Examination Centre District

37. You are allowed to change your choice of examination centre district* **on or before 5 December 2024 without the payment of a supplementary fee**. You should request your school to update your choice of district* on the Registration System directly before the above deadline. Candidates who request such amendment **between 6 December and 14 December 2024** will be required to apply in person or via an authorised representative at the HKEAA Southorn Centre office and pay a supplementary fee of \$461 at the time of application. Applications after 14 December 2024 will normally **not** be accepted unless valid reasons can be given. Such requests made thereafter will be subject to approval and the payment of a higher supplementary fee \$921.

* Includes the change of choice of examination centre district/change of sitting the core subject examinations in Home Centre to Non-home Centre or vice versa

L. Withdrawal from the Examination

38. Candidates who wish to withdraw from the 2025 HKDSE must inform the HKEAA via their School Principal by completing the relevant form, which is available for download from the Registration System main page, and returning it to the HKEAA Southorn Centre office **on or before 30 November 2024**. Candidates will receive a partial refund of the fees he/she paid (namely any amount left after the deduction of an administration fee of \$524). An order cheque for the refund of the examination fees will be sent to the candidates concerned. If the cheque has to be made payable to the parent of the candidate, a copy of the candidate's birth certificate should be submitted with the application for withdrawal. Refund of examination fee paid will **not** be made for requests received **after 30 November 2024**.
39. Candidates receiving 'Full' level of assistance need not pay the administration fee of \$524 while those receiving 'Half' level of assistance shall pay half of the administration fee (i.e. \$262) at the time of withdrawal. Both cases will be regarded by the SFO as one attempt of EFR.
40. **No refund** of subject fee nor supplementary fee (if any) is payable if a subject is deleted at the candidate's request.

41. If the candidates' marks of Category B subject(s) have been submitted to the HKEAA, the results of the Category B subject(s) concerned will be retained and be shown on their 2025 HKDSE results notice and certificate (if applicable). Under such circumstances, only partial deletion of Category A and Category C subjects instead of withdrawal from the examination would be accepted while a partial refund* of the examination fees for the Category A and Category C subject(s) after the deduction of an administration fee will be made to the candidate. **No refund** of the examination fee will be made to the candidate if the requests are received **after the above deadline** except under special circumstances.

* The HKEAA will reimburse the examination fees paid after the deduction of an administration fee by issuing an order cheque to the candidate concerned. If the cheque has to be made payable to the parent of the candidate, a copy of the candidate's birth certificate should be submitted together with the application for withdrawal from the examination.

M. Candidates with Special Needs

42. Candidates with disabilities

- (1) Candidates with special needs (such as candidates with disabilities/chronic illness) may apply via schools for special examination arrangements (SEAs) (e.g. sitting examinations at special centres, extra time allowance, supervised breaks, braille/enlarged question papers, etc.) or exemption from component(s)/part(s) of an examination. Applications should be submitted via the SEA Online Services from **4 September to 24 September 2024**. Each application should be accompanied by supporting documents. Late applications without valid reasons will not be accepted.
- (2) Where a candidate has been exempted from component(s)/part(s) of an examination, his/her results for the affected component(s)/part(s) will be assessed by the HKEAA based on his/her performance in the other component(s)/part(s) of the examination sat. The details of any such assessment will be indicated on the candidate's certificate. However, the reason for granting the exemption and the SEAs made will not be recorded.

43. Candidates with Colour-Blindness/Colour Amblyopia Problems

These candidates should apply to the HKEAA through the SEA Online Services and submit a medical/assessment report issued by an ophthalmologist/optometrist/the Department of Health for special consideration of SEAs in the arrangement of question papers. For question papers containing coloured diagrams/photographs, these candidates will be given a set of black-white photocopied question papers in addition to the normal question papers. For questions requiring colour differentiation, in case no indication of the colours is provided, special consideration and appropriate marking will be given by the markers in accordance with the assessment objectives and requirements of the questions. However, candidates entering for **Geography** should note that coloured maps will usually be included in the question papers and no special arrangements will be made in this respect.

44. The 'Application Guide for SEAs' can be downloaded from the HKEAA website on www.hkeaa.edu.hk/en/Candidates/special_needs_candidates/hkdse.html.

N. Handbook for Candidates' and Admission Forms

45. Hardcopies of the 'Handbook for Candidates' will not be provided to candidates. Candidates should view the electronic version of the Handbook which will be available on the HKEAA website in mid-December 2024 while a few hardcopies will be provided to schools. The admission forms will be issued to school candidates in mid-February 2025 (tentative) through their schools.

Note: School candidates who have entered for Physical Education and/or Music will receive the Admission Form for Practical Examinations in late January 2025 (tentative) through their schools. Candidates entering for the Physical Education examination will also receive the 'Instructions to Candidates' (for Paper 3) at the same time.

O. Regulation on Use of Calculators in Examination

46. The use of calculators in the examination is permitted (except language subjects), but the calculator must have been pad-printed with the 'H.K.E.A.A. APPROVED' or 'H.K.E.A. APPROVED' label. If your calculator does not have the label, you are advised to purchase a calculator already pad-printed with the required label or if you want to have it pad-printed, you should refer to the pad-printing schedule in the 'Handbook for Candidates' which will be uploaded to the HKEAA website in mid-December 2024. .

P. Publications

47. Hardcopies of the ‘2025 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination Regulations and Assessment Frameworks’ are not available for sale. Candidates are advised to view the electronic version available on the HKEAA website.
