This means tourists are able to keep ~~to~~ stay interested when travelling.

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Qa) Lastly, the second characteristic of an organised mass tourist is that they travel to countries within their environmental 'bubble' for areas which ensures familiarity of a destination. They can benefit from cultural homogenisation as cultures develop, more souvenirs can be built and sold to them. For example, the ~~Chingay~~ 'Chingay Chin Ban Festival' may release merchandise such as key chains, shirts, etc. Organised mass tourists would then buy these merchandise as souvenirs to bring back as a gift to their home town.

The third characteristic is cultural ~~commercialisation~~ ^{commodification} commercialisation. This impacts tourism development as different cultures globally would develop handicrafts and services to sell for tourists. For example, the festivals such as Christmas ^{is known and} ~~would be~~ popular around the world, and commodity related to Christmas would be created to promote the culture to tourists.

The fourth characteristic is westernisation / americanisation. This impacts tourism development as developing countries would try to become like America in terms of culture, behaviour etc. for

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(b) example, Africa would celebrate festivals and holidays such as 'Easter'. Other countries would take the festival and adapt it for themselves as a holiday, becoming like the west.

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The last characteristic is the domination effect. This occurs when local ~~people~~ people towards teacher and culture to work & develop one themselves. 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(a) Example, the ~~company~~ staff may have short paychecks, difficult, etc... This would affect the service as some service workers may feel lazy or unmotivated to do work. As a result, a service delivery gap is developed.

8(b) The first economic impact is that MICE travellers and members are unable ~~to~~ provide tourism revenue in the host destination. 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If it mainly serve customer who are here to entertain and relax while compare to chain hotel in Central, its business mix is higher than the hotel in Lanfan that it serve many business tourist; so the Domestic tourist would more likely to visit ^{such as spa} Lanfan hotel in

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Third, the facilities. Domestic tourists with healthy concern would more likely to feel accommodation with more health and care facilities more attractive while the privately-owned hotel in Lanfan ^{such as spa} would have more healthy and care facilities than the chain hotel in Central as it serve more leisure tourist who come here to relax however the chain hotel would provide a lot of business facilities such as computer, network system as they mainly attract business tourist, so the hotel in Lanfan Town would attract more domestic tourists.

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Fourth, the staff to room ratio. Domestic tourist with health concern would like to have a lower staff to room ratio as they do not want to have many contact with the staff while the small-care

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privately-owned hotel match the request of domestic tourist as they have a lower staff-to-room ratio, the domestic tourist would not meet many staff and can be less concern about the spread of disease or cross-contamination, but the chain hotel have a high staff-to-room ratio that the hotel have many staff, the risk of spreading the disease would be higher and thus the privately-owned hotel in Lantau Island would attract more domestic tourists with health as their primary concern.
