c) It could fulfill the dimensions of tangibility. It refers to the things that the customers can see, touch, smell and feel. It can create a very vital first impression to the customers. The first and last impression have the greater impact on customers' perception of business. ABC Hotel Restaurant can has an impressive interior decoration which can impress customers' experience. Besides, it could fulfill the dimensions of responsiveness, which relates to the speed, timeliness, efficiency and courtesy of services, the servers can take orders and serve food accurately.

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(Q3d) The event organisers should arrange some professional to translate the language to Thai and Arabic. Besides, the event organisers should arrange the restaurants that are suitable for their taste. In addition, they should arrange a period for them to have a pray due to their religions belief.

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(Q3a) In the West Kowloon Cultural District, it provides a lots of attractions to customers with different travel motivations, like travel motivators of pleasure, curiosity, religious and spiritual appreciation and root syndrome.

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First, it can attract the tourists with the travel motivation of pleasure. They can visit West Kowloon Cultural District to give round the life a break and release pressure. For example, the tourists can go the freespace to gather with friends and family and relax.

Second, the travel motivators of curiosity can attract the tourists to the West Kowloon Cultural District. Tourists can release pressure and relax by appreciating the the picturesque landscape. 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Fourth, the tourists may visit the West Kowloon Cultural District due to their motivation of root syndrome. They may want to explore the culture and history of the homeland and learn the lifestyle of the grandparents, so that they can familiarize themselves with their home country and their relatives. For example, they can go to Xiqu centre to explore the history of Chinese opera and the entertainment of previous generation of their family.

To conclude, it can attract different tourists with different travel motivations.

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Q3b) There are 5 characteristics of tourism products, and the West Kowloon Cultural District could apply them to Improve tourists' experience.

First, the tourism products are intangible. It is the things that the tourists cannot touch, see, smell, feel before they purchase.

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Q5(b) According to the twelve aims of the Agenda for Sustainable tourism, the economic aims of employment quality, economic viability and local prosperity and also the environmental aims of biological diversity and physical integrity could be achieved by adopting fair trade practices in the tourism development of rural areas.

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First, the economic aims of employment quality is to enhance and strengthen the number and the quality of local jobs that created and supported by the tourism industry. For example, increasing the employment opportunities in the rural areas, like tour guides, coach drivers, hotel staff, etc.

Second, the economic aims of economic viability is to ensure and enhance the competitiveness of the tourist destination. For example, ensuring the development of the attractive destination in the rural areas, like the natural, wildlife and habitats.

Third, the economic aims of local prosperity is to maximize the contribution of tourism to the economic prosperity of the host destinations. For example, the rural areas can support the local-owned business.

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Fourth, the environmental aims of biological diversity could be achieved by adopting fair trade practices in the tourism development of rural areas. The destinations should support the conservation of natures, wildlife and habitats. For example, the rural areas can promote the management and development of ecotourism.

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Finally, the resource efficiency can also be achieved. The purpose is to reduce the use of scarce and non-renewable resources in the development. For example, the rural areas can plan a provision of water and energy supplies and promote the importance of reuse, reduce and recycle.

Thirdly, for the special request of picking up at the airport, the reservation department will collaborate with concierge to send an airport representative to pick up the family from the airport.

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a) The two elements of MICE that were included in the training programme were incentives and convention.

The convention was the one that took place on Day one, where more than 200 people joined the award ceremony and celebrity, this is considered a convention because the number of people are more than 100.

The incentive provided by the company is either a Helicopter Tour or Luxurious spa Treatment and also dinner at a Michelin-starred Restaurant, this is an opportunity for the employees to enjoy so it is considered an incentive.

bii) The core product of the ABC Theme Park was the service, as mentioned by one of the participants that the park provides wheelchair rental services for people in need, which is a core product.

The facilitating product is the attractions, which made the guest interested in exploration of science and technology. 'Dancing With Robots' and 'Adventure on Mars' were the facilitating products, which are the attractions.

c) The first service dimension the restaurant could fulfil was the reliability, which means being reliable, the

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evidence for this is that the participants mentioned that the servers took orders and served their food accurately.

Secondly, they fulfilled tangibility, the evidence for this is that the participant mentioned that the interior decoration was impressive. Tangibility refers to visually pleasing so the designs pleased the participants.

d) In terms of religion, many people from Tunisia are muslims, so the event organisers should have provided them with prayer rooms for praying in the convention hall, so that they can pray.

In terms of language, people from Thailand speak Thai so they should have leaflets or translators to help them understand what the people in the activity are doing or saying.

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a) There are both similarities and differences between using a management contract and franchising to operate a hotel.

The first similarity from the perspective of the property developer is that there is acquisition of operational expertise for both which will reduce the chance of business failure and enhance service quality.

The second similarity from the perspective of the property developer is that the hotel will gain national or international recognition if it is run by reputable management enterprise or is a franchisee to a reputable franchise.

There are also differences between using a management contract and franchising to operate a hotel.

The first difference from the perspective of the property developer is that, for management contract, the owner is not required to be involved in the hotels' daily operation while for franchising the franchisee has complete control and responsibility over the daily operation of the property.

The second difference from the perspective of the property developer is that franchisee may have a risk of termination of contract or no continuation of new contract.

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if the franchisor wants to take the right of operations while a management contract period can last for five, ten or twenty years.

Based on the similarities and differences of using a management contract and franchising to operate a hotel, the following are the reasons why using a management contract is more suitable.

Firstly, based on differences, since the property developer lacks experience in the hotel industry, so the difference of the owner not having to be required to be involved in hotels' daily operation will make things convenient for the hotel owner.

Secondly, based on differences, to avoid risk of contract termination or no continuation from franchisor, it's a better to choose management contract as it is reliable since the management contract period can last for five, ten or twenty years.

Thirdly, based on similarities. Since the owner lacks experience, the advantage of having acquisition operational expertise can reduce the chance of business failure and enhance service quality despite lack of hotel experience of the property developer.

Lastly, based on the similarities, from management

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contract, the owner can gain national or international recognition for the hotel if it is run by a reputable management enterprise.

Above are why management contract is more suitable compared to franchising.

b) The following are the characteristics of tourists who organise or attend exhibitions in the conference hotel.

Firstly, these tourists are not affected by the seasonality, they travel anytime of the year to conduct business.

Secondly, these tourists are not bothered by the price or charges of the hotel, they only require ~~good~~ top notch services.

Thirdly, these travellers usually require extra services such as shoe polishing, laundry and ironing.

The front - of - the house, firstly, the receptionist should offer them the best type of available room.

The back - of - the house, housekeeping department

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Should clean their room thoroughly and take their clothes for laundry and ironing.

The telephone department should give the guests the wake up call if required.

The bell boy should help taking their luggage to the room if they're in a hurry.

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a) The following are the four differences in menu, services and theme of a fine-dining restaurant and a café.

Firstly, the difference in menu is that a fine-dining restaurant provides an a la carte menu while a café provides mostly drinks with just some snacks or sandwiches.

Secondly, the difference in the service is that fine-dining restaurant has a high staff-to-guest ratio while a café has low staff-to-guest ratio.

Thirdly, the difference in the service is that for fine-dining restaurant it is table service while in a café you have to order at the counter by your own self.

Fourthly, the difference in the theme is that a fine-dining restaurant has an elegant decoration and luxurious feel while a café has more of cozy feel because of the warm colours and environment.

Secondly, from customer to service staff, the customer should show appreciation to service staff for their good service, for example, by giving the staff a tip for good service provided.

Thirdly, customer to restaurant, the customer can

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give the restaurant a feedback or advice. for example, pointing outs the things the guest wasn't satisfy with so that the restaurant can make differences and improve service quality.

Fourthly, restaurant to customer, the restaurant should take customer advice and feedback into consideration, for example to make improvements to the services that the guests weren't satisfied with so that the customer can have better experience next time.

Lastly, service staff to restaurant, the service ~~standa~~ staff should follow service standard accurately so that the restaurant reputation is good; for example, providing prompt and accurate services. ~~at~~

All of the above can contribute to successful service provision at fine-dining restaurant.

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
