HKALE grades will be considered in conjunction with HKCEE grades. HKCEE (where A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, E=1) Diploma Stage I: Min 3 points HKCEE. Diploma Stage II: Min 2 points HKALE. Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must take?	Yes, the HKALE students must either obtain a C grade in Use of English, or satisfy the University's English requirements with an international English test.	A minimum HKALE Use of English grade E overall with consistent sub-scores; or HKCEE English Language (Syllabus B) grade D overall with consistent sub-scores or IELTS with a minimum score of 5.5 and individual bands not less than 4.5 or other acceptable test of English language at the same standard. Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must reach?	IELTS: An overall band score of 6.0 (no individual band less than 6) TOEFL: Minimum score of 550 including TWE of 5 (or Computer Based TOEFL score of 213 with an essay rating of 5 or better) International Baccalaureate: Minimum Grade 3 at Higher level for an English subject

Additional criteria may be required for some programs e.g. Visual and Performing Arts (portfolio or audition) and Law (personal statement)</p>	<p>Yes – relevant work experience and mature age entry.</p>
<p>Does your University/College accept the International Baccalaureate?</p>	<p>Yes. Minimum of 24 points (all courses except Law) Minimum of 28 points (Law) consisting of aggregate from 3 higher level & 3 subsidiary level</p>	<p>Yes - 20 points.</p>
<p>Does your University/College accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?</p>	<p>In general, yes, however, there may be student visa implications for students under the age of 18 – see http://www.immi.gov.au/students/students/chooser/index.htm for further information.</p> <p>Admission to degree programs is based on academic merit not age, though because of possible visa implications it is normally expected applicants under the age of 18 will have a blood relative over the age of 21 as a guardian in Australia, or their guardian/parent will accompany them to study in Australia. Other under 18 applicants will be considered on a case by case basis.</p>	<p>Yes. Entry is based on academic merit, not age. Minimum requirement is completion of HKCEE/Year 11 equivalent.</p>
