Those applying to non-interview courses, i.e. Biomedical Science BSc and Biomedical Science (International) BSc, must in addition take part in an informal Skype interview with a member of the Admissions Team and the university's Immigration Advisor. This is in order to meet UK Visa and Immigration's requirement that students be assessed in all four English language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking).</p>

Applicants to Medicine must demonstrate at interview that they have the necessary skills to become successful doctors, as described in the document "Tomorrow's Doctors" which can be found at http://www.gmc-uk.org/education/undergraduate/tomorrows_doctors.asp. Applicants to all clinical courses must show that they have completed relevant extra-curricular experience in both caring and non-caring settings which they are able to relate to their chosen degree.
