Does your University/College accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University/College?	Yes. We consider HKCEE as GCSE equivalent and HKALE as A level equivalent on a subject-for-subject basis.
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University/College?	We would require students to achieve grades which are in line with those required at GCSE and A level. These are set out in our Prospectus ( <a href="http://www.imperial.ac.uk/ugprospectus">www.imperial.ac.uk/ugprospectus</a> ) and on the UCAS website ( <a href="http://www.ucas.ac.uk/">www.ucas.ac.uk/</a> ).
Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University/College?	We require all applicants for our undergraduate Medicine (A100), Bio Medical Science (B900) and two Pharmacology courses (BB29 and BB2X) courses to take the BioMedical Admissions Test (BMAT) ( <a href="http://www.bmat.org.uk/">www.bmat.org.uk/</a> ) .
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must take?	No.
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must reach?	We are happy to accept students who have achieved Level 3 or above in HKCEE English Language. Otherwise, we would require a pass in an approved English Language test. Details of the approved qualifications, and the minimum acceptable grades, can be found on our website ( <a href="http://www.imperial.ac.uk/registry/admissions/ugenglish">www.imperial.ac.uk/registry/admissions/ugenglish</a> ).
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College must take? When must they be taken?	No
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University/College?	No, although we have a restriction on the number of places available to 'overseas' fee-paying students on our Medicine course.

Is consideration given to factors other than examination performance for overseas students wishing to apply for entry to your University/College? Does your University/College accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes
Does your University/College accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	Students should normally not be less than 17 years of age at entry, although those entering the Medicine course must normally have reached the age of 18 by 1 October of the year of entry. Students who are below 17 years of age may only be admitted with the approval of the Chair of the Undergraduate Admission Committee and one of the College Tutors.
