Does your University accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University?	Yes. HKCEE grades are considered as equivalent to GCSE (with the exception of the English Lang Syllabus A as described). HKALE grades are also considered equivalent to A level.
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University?	Basically, the same grades as those specified for UK AS/A level and differ from programme to programme. There may also be GCSE (and therefore HKCEE) requirements, such as for medicine/dentistry.
Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University?	No. However, we are planning to introduce an entrance examination for medicine and dentistry for September 2007 entry which will be sat by all applicants.
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take?	If applicants have studied and been examined in English for a suitable period of time no English language qualification is required. However, if this is not the case, a test will be required (IELTS, TOEFL etc).
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must reach?	
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take? When must they be taken?	No
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University?	No unless they are applying to medicine or dentistry. For these programmes, only 7.5% of the cohort may be international (high fee paying) students.

Is consideration given to factors other than examination performance for overseas students wishing to apply for entry to your University?	This very much depends on the programme. Generally, exam performance (or predictions) is the most important although the whole application will be considered – personal statement, reference etc. For programmes like medicine and dentistry, non-academic requirements are as important as academic record.
Does your University accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes, many applicants offer the IB.
Does your University accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	For most programmes, yes although it would depend on how young. For some health related programmes (in particular medicine and dentistry), no.
