Does your University accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University?	Yes. HKCEE grades are considered direct equivalents to GCSE exams. The HKALE grades are equivalent to GCE A-level (apart from mathematics and science subjects where tutors would recognize that a B grade in HKALE is equivalent to an A grade at A-level).
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University?	HKALE grades AAA (unless mathematics or science subjects for which B grades would be acceptable). HKCEE in a broad range of subjects – the majority should be grade A. Some of the degree courses have subject-specific requirements; details can be found in our prospectus or online ( <a href="http://www.admissions.ox.ac.uk">www.admissions.ox.ac.uk</a> ).
Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University?	For certain courses at Oxford a written test is a compulsory element; details can be found in our prospectus or online ( <a href="http://www.admissions.ox.ac.uk">www.admissions.ox.ac.uk</a> ).
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take?	No (unless the student is applying for a course involving modern languages, in which case there will be a written test in the appropriate language as part of the admissions procedure).
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must reach?	There are no formal requirements. If the school teaching has been in English then there is no need for any further assessment. As a guide for non-native speakers, we would recommend a minimum score of 7.0 in each element in the IELTS.
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take? When must they be taken?	No.
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University?	No, unless they are applying to read Medicine. Medicine is the only subject that has a restriction on the number of places available to non-EU applicants. This quota is imposed by the UK government and is currently set at 7 students per year per institution.

Does your University accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes. We would generally expect students to have obtained/be predicted to obtain an overall points score of at least 38 (excluding bonus points), with scores of 6 or 7 in the subjects studied at the Higher level.
Does your University accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	Students will normally be at least 17 years of age at the point of entry. The University is in the process of reviewing its policies with respect to overseas students under the age of 18.
