Does your University accept the HKCEE and HKALE for admission to your University?	Yes, we accept HKCEE and HKALE for admission. A student should apply in the second year of HKALE study.
What are the entry requirements for a student with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications entering your University?	We do not set minimum grade requirements, but a student should have mostly, if not all, A grades in both exams.
Do students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications have to sit an entrance examination to enter your University?	No. They might be required to take departmental placement exams at the beginning of their first year, though.
Is there a language proficiency test that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take?	If a student has not been studying in English for the last five years of secondary school, TOEFL is required.
Is there a standard on an international English scale that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must reach?	Please see <a href="http://apply.jhu.edu/">http://apply.jhu.edu/</a> for TOEFL requirements.
Are there any other tests that students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University must take? When must they be taken?	We require applicants submit either the SAT Critical Reasoning test or the ACT with Writing test. These tests should be taken no later than January of the year the student wishes to matriculate. We prefer, though, that testing is completed by the December that precedes the August in which the student wishes to matriculate.
Is there an entry quota that applies to students with HKCEE and HKALE qualifications wishing to enter your University?	No.

Is consideration given to factors other than examination performance for overseas students wishing to apply for entry to your University?	Yes. We take a holistic approach to application review. A student's academic performance is weighed along with extra-curricular involvement, recommendation letters, essays, and standardized test scores.
Does your University accept the International Baccalaureate?	Yes. Credit can be awarded for Higher Level exam scores of 6 or 7 in math, science, and foreign language subjects. Credit is awarded just prior to a student's matriculation.
Does your University accept students if they are under the age of 18 at the time of commencing studies?	Yes. A student must be at least 16 to live in the residence halls. Students younger than 16 must live with a parent or guardian in private housing.
